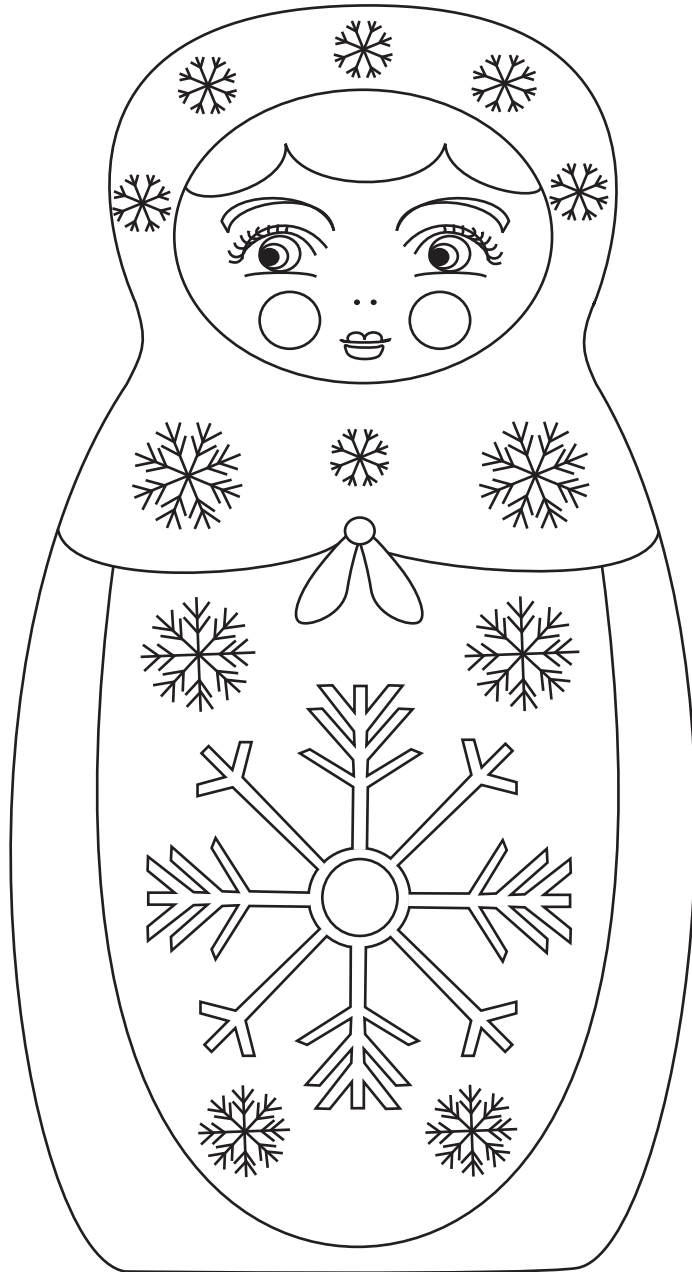

Using This Pattern

Printing Tips:

This pattern is in PDF format, which means you can print it in any size you desire without losing quality. If left as-is, it is the same size as the original embroidery and will fit easily on a U.S. letter-sized paper (8.5" x 11").

Transfer Tips:

There are a variety of ways to transfer this pattern to your fabric, including tracing directly with transfer pens and pencils. Here are some other methods to try:

1. Create an iron-on transfer. There is no need to reverse the image, as it is symmetrical in design.
2. Print the image on glossy photo paper with a laser-jet printer. There is no need to reverse the image, as it is symmetrical in design. Dampen your fabric and lay on a flat area. Place the photo paper, ink side down, onto the damp fabric and use even pressure over the back of the paper until the image has transferred. The ink will wash out of most fabrics when you're finished stitching.
3. Print the image using toner-based ink, such as is found in many photocopiers. There is no need to reverse the image, as it is symmetrical in design. Place the image ink side down on your fabric and go over it with a dry iron, pressing for a few seconds at a time, until the image has transferred. The ink will wash out of most fabrics when you're finished.
4. Print the image directly onto printable fabric.

Stitching Tips:

You can use a variety of stitches and colors to create different lines and textures. Try stitching in a monochromatic pattern, or get creative and use as many colors as you can! If you need inspiration, try searching the Internet for photographs of real Matryoshka dolls.
